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The City of Bristol Emergency Management Services Helps Students and Their Families Prepare Emergency Communication Plans

BRISTOL, CONN., March 15, 2019 – Emergency Management Department of the City of Bristol, led by Director, Harland (Harley) Graime and in partnership with volunteers from the City of Bristol Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), the Bristol Police Department, and the Bristol Fire Department have been conducting a **STEP (Student Tools for Emergency Planning)** Program in the Bristol schools. Now in its fourth year, the program is presented to all fifth graders in the City of Bristol to educate them on being prepared for emergencies with the intent that they take the information home to share with their families. The materials for the program are provided by FEMA and include a manual with instructions on how to help the students and their families complete an emergency communication plan and how to put together a disaster supply kit. At the end of the presentation, each student is given a backpack to take home that includes a flashlight, whistle, and Mylar blanket.

The intent of the program is to present the information to students in a fun, interactive environment with the opportunity to ask questions and discuss how to be prepared for emergencies including a house fire, natural disasters such as hurricanes, floods or blizzards, and teaching them the differences between disasters and emergencies.

“Our visits to the fifth grade classes in each of the eight schools in Bristol reaches almost 600 students and gives us the opportunity to provide this valuable life-saving information to all Bristol families – it takes everyone, youth, family members, and the community to help all of us be prepared in the event of a disaster or emergency,” stated Harley Graime, Emergency Management Director for the City of Bristol who coordinates the program through the State of CT Department of Emergency Management and Homeland Security and the Bristol Board of Education every year.

The program is a service provided at no cost by the Emergency Management Department of the City of Bristol and presented by members from CERT using a series of lessons for each subject along with short videos to reinforce the material. The students are quizzed at the end of each segment with an opportunity for students to share their knowledge about each subject. At the end of the program Bristol police officers and firefighters are on hand to talk to the students about the importance of bringing home the information they’ve just learned to their families and sharing it with them so that they can develop their own family emergency communication plan and disaster supply kit customized to their family’s needs.
