### ***BRISTOL ANNOUNCES 2020 SPRING PAVING PROGRAM***

BRISTOL, CT) – The City of Bristol's Public Works Department has released its schedule for the 2020 spring paving program which will be completed in two phases. The initial phase consists of milling off the existing bituminous pavement of the road. The second phase consists of installing a new bituminous roadway surface and will commence shortly after the first phase. Once construction is complete, the City will repair any affected driveway aprons.

The 2020 spring roadway resurfacing program begins on May 18, 2020. As part of the program, the following streets will be milled and then resurfaced:

Salvatore Avenue	Hart Street (Peacedale to Burlington Town Line)
Leslie Court	Josephine Terrace
Cherry Street	Long Lane
Jefferson Avenue	New Street
Chapel Street	Brewster Road (Queen to Rotary)
Emmett St. (Pine to Surrey)	Birchwood Drive
Sheffield Lane	Redstone Hill Road (Middle to Emmett)
Knollwood Drive	Blue Meadow Drive
Tulip Street (Park to Divinity)	Main Street (South Street to Blvd)
Magnolia Avenue	Geary Avenue
Sherwood Road	Ferraro Drive
Carmelo Road	Vanderbilt Road
Round Hill Road	Hull Street (South to East Rd)
Rogers Road	Ridgewood Street

"There may be minor traffic delays during construction, however roads will remain open for mail delivery, emergency vehicles, and local traffic at all times," said Mayor Ellen Zoppo-Sassu.

"Temporary "No Parking" signs will be posted as needed during construction."

“In addition to the spring paving program, the Sharon Street, Dover Street and Warren Street neighborhood will undergo reconstruction of the roadways surfaces,” said Councilman Greg Hahn. “This process is much more involved and residents in the affected areas will receive a separate notice outlining the extensive work this road reconstruction entails. This project is anticipated to begin May 4, 2020.

Also, the State of Connecticut will be paving a portion of Route 72 from Main Street to the 72/69 proposed project on School Street. Questions or concerns regarding this project should be directed to the State Department of Transportation: [www.ct.gov/dot](http://www.ct.gov/dot)

Eversource will also be paving Birch Street and Ronzo Road from the curb to the centerline to repair their trench work from last summer.
