



CITY ANNOUNCES END OF FREE BRUSH/WOOD DEBRIS CURBSIDE COLLECTION FROM TROPICAL STORM ISAIAS

Mayor Ellen Zoppo-Sassu announced today that the City of Bristol Public Works has completed City-wide curbside collection in the aftermath of Tropical Storm Isaias. “The DPW crews worked hard to complete curbside collections within two weeks of the storm, which when you think about the amount of damage and debris is pretty amazing,” said Mayor Zoppo-Sassu.

Saturday, August 22nd is the last day for extended hours (7:30am-5pm) at the City’s Transfer Station on Lake Avenue for residents to dispose of their brush/wood debris for free and not requiring a transfer station permit.

Public Works Director Ray Rogozinski stated that the department operations will return to normal beginning the week of August 24. “The brush/branch collection service will still be offered during the Yard Waste season, which runs through the first week of November,” he said. “It should be noted that Brush/Branch collection services are by appointment only and are scheduled on Wednesdays. After this week when the free drop off service ends, brush and branches (bundled per the requirements) along with other yard waste is still available for city residents at the Solid Waste Transfer Station with a residential permit.
