Bristol Public Works Department to Present Composting 101 Workshop in November

(BRISTOL, CT: November 7, 2022) –The Bristol Public Works Department will be hosting a composting workshop at the Bristol Public Library on Wednesday November 9, 2022 from 5:30 to 7:30 pm.

Alastair Ong, Esq., a graduate of the UConn Extension Master Gardener Program, will be presenting the workshop where participants will learn the benefits of composting using Alastair’s method to an easy way to compost which does not involve a lot of time or work and requires no chemistry, turning, or heavy lifting.

All are welcome to attend – all Bristol residents who attend will receive a 2.5 gallon Kitchen Composter. All attendees will be entered into a raffle for a chance to win a portable greenhouse. The workshop and free materials are funded through an annual grant from Covanta to bring workshops and programs to the Bristol community to engage adults and younger citizens in environmental issues which affect us all.

Composting helps to divert food waste from the waste stream and is organic material that can be added to soil to help plants grow. Food scraps and yard waste together currently make up about 30 percent of what we throw away, and should be composted instead. Making compost keeps these materials out of landfills where they take up space and release methane, a potent greenhouse gas.
