***CITY OF BRISTOL TO PARTNER WITH THE STATE OF CT DPH AND GRIFFIN HEALTH TO BRING MOBILE VACCINE CLINICS TO BRISTOL IN APRIL AND MAY***

Mayor Jeffrey Caggiano and the City of Bristol's Emergency Management Director, Harley Graime announced today that the City of Bristol will be partnering with the State of Connecticut Department of Public Health and Griffin Health to bring **FREE** mobile vaccine clinics to Bristol during the months of April and May.

A Griffin Health van will be deployed to several locations on several dates to make it convenient for the community to obtain COVID-19 vaccines. In addition, Griffin Health will be offering **FREE** health screenings which will include diabetes testing, A1c testing, and blood pressure screenings.

All clinics are open to the public with no appointments needed. Please bring a health insurance card and a photo ID if you have them, but it is not necessary to have health insurance or an ID to receive the vaccine. ***No one will be turned away for lack of insurance or ID.***

The following is a list of locations and times for each of the vaccine clinics:

1. Rockwell Park – Mrs. Rockwell's Pavilion, 238 Jacobs Street, Bristol, CT 06010  
**Every Saturday from 12 pm to 6 pm beginning April 8<sup>th</sup>**
2. Bristol Senior Center, 240 Stafford Avenue, Bristol, CT 06010  
**Every Other Tuesday from 11 am to 5 pm beginning on April 11<sup>th</sup>**
3. City Hall East (former Webster Bank), 150 Main Street, Bristol, CT 06010  
**Every Other Tuesday beginning April 18<sup>th</sup> from 10 am to 2 pm**

"We want to be able to continue to make COVID vaccines easily accessible for everyone," stated Mayor Jeffrey Caggiano. The City of Bristol is grateful to be able to partner with the State Department of Public Health and Griffith Health to host these vaccine clinics throughout Bristol making it easier for those in the community who wish to be vaccinated."
